Neges gan Richard ❖ Richard's Message

Gall diwylliant dreiddio i'n meddyliau; yn ymwybodol ac yn isymwybodol. Gall pethau fel caneuon, dramâu, llyfrau a ffilmiau—a'r straeon y maent yn eu portreadu—fynd o dan ein croen a chreu disgwyliad diofyn o 'sut mae pethau'n gweithio'. Er enghraifft, mae'n hawdd syrthio i'r fagl o gredu ymadroddion rhy-saccharîn o ramant, neu'r mantra "gallwch chi fod/gwneud unrhyw beth rydych chi ei eisiau os ydych chi'n credu ynoch chi'ch hun."

Y rhan fwyaf o'r amser mae'n gymharol ddiniwed, ac rydym yn datblygu'r gallu i weld trwyddo a chydabod bod realiti bron bob amser yn fwy cymhleth. Ond weithiau gall syniad fod yn fwy cynnil, gan weithio ei ffordd i mewn i'n canfyddiad bywyd heb i ni sylwi.

Mae yna lawer o straeon am bobl yn cymryd neu'n datgelu pŵer a dylanwad mawr. Mewn eiliadau o ddrama uchel, rydym yn dod yn ymwybodol o'u rhagoriaeth i bawb a phopeth o'u cwmpas. Efallai bod gennych chi arwr neu ddihiryn ffantasi mewn golwg, neu efallai arweinydd gwleidyddol yn codi i rym. Yr hyn yr ydym yn ei ragweld mae'n debyg yn digwydd nesaf yw bod y person hwnnw'n dangos y pŵer hwnnw, neu'n ei ddefnyddio mewn rhyw weithred ryfeddol o awdurdod.

Mae drama yn magu drama.

Yr hyn mae'n debyg nad ydym wedi cael ein hyfforddi'n ddiwylliannol i'w ddisgwyl yw arddangosiad o bŵer i'w ddilyn gan dawelwch a thynnerwch.

Culture can permeate into our thoughts; both conscious and sub-conscious. Things like songs, plays, books and films—and the stories which they portray—can get under our skin and create a default expectation of 'how things work'. For example it's easy to fall into the trap of believing overly-saccharine expressions of romance, or the mantra "you can be/do anything you want if you just believe in yourself."

Most of the time it's relatively harmless, and we develop the ability to see through it and recognise that reality is nearly always more nuanced. But sometimes an idea can be more subtle, working it's way into our perception of how life is without us noticing.

There are many stories—some real, some fictional—of people taking or revealing great power and influence. In moments of high drama, we become aware of their superiority to everyone and everything around them. You might have a fantasy super-hero or villain in mind, or perhaps a political leader rising to power. What we probably anticipate happening next is that person demonstrating that power, or wielding it in some remarkable act of authority.

Drama breeds drama.

What we probably culturally trained ourselves to expect is for a display or power to be followed by quietness and gentleness.

Ar fore'r Pasg, wrth i Iesu adael y bedd y gosodwyd ef ynddo, fe'i datguddiwyd fel gorchfygwr pechod a marwolaeth. Yr oedd y pŵer a'r gallu a ddangosodd Ei arwyddion a'i wyrthiau yn hynod, ond rhywbeth arall oedd hyn. Yma yr oedd Ei Dduwinyddiaeth yn cael ei harddangos.

Ond eto y mae Efe yn aros yn yr ardd i gyfarfod â'r gwraidd a fydd yn dyfod, â dagrau ar eu gruddiau, i ofalu am Ei gorff marw Ef.

Mae'n cyfarch Mary trwy ddweud ei henw, ac yna mae'n gofyn iddi sicrhau bod Ei ffrindiau ofnus, torcalonnus, yn gwybod ei fod yn fyw.

Yn ddiweddarach, mae'n paratoi brechwast traeth, gan wneud yn siŵr y bydd cyfle i Pedr, sydd wedi'i glymu ag euogrwydd yn ei wadiad o Iesu, gael sicrwydd o faddeuant a chael ei adfer a chael urddas.

Mae'n gwneud yn siŵr nad yw Tomos, na chafodd y neges am siawns i gwrdd â'i Dduw atgyfodedig, yn cael ei anghofio, a bod ganddo foment deimladwy, breifat ei hun o ddatguddiad.

Nid oes dim o'r addfwynder tawel hwnnw'n lleihau pŵer yr Atgyfodiad, er nad dyna sut y byddai ein diwylliant wedi ei ysgrifennu.

Felly, sut bydd yr Iesu Pwerus ac Atgyfodedig yn cwrdd â chi heddiw?

On Easter morning, as Jesus left the tomb in which he had been laid, He was revealed as the conqueror of sin and death. The power and ability which His signs and miracles had demonstrated was remarkable, but this was something else. Here was His Divinity on display.

And yet He waits in the garden to meet the women who will be coming, with tears on their cheeks, to tend to His dead body.

He greets Mary by saying her name, and then He asks her to make sure that His scared, heartbroken, friends know that He is alive.

Later, He prepares a beach breakfast, making sure that there will be a chance for Peter, wracked with guilt at his denial of Jesus, to be assured of forgiveness and reinstated and given dignity.

He makes sure that Thomas, who didn't get the memo about meeting his resurrected God, isn't forgotten, and has his own touching, private moment of revelation.

None of that quiet gentleness diminishes the power of the Resurrection, even though it's not how our culture would have written it.

So, how will the Powerful, Risen Jesus meet you today?
